Colorado College College Ahead Program		4/1/2008	This program gives students the opportunity to try a pre college course for free. There are no costs for this 2 week program. This is primarily a program devoted to Juniors and Sophomores looking to go to college in the future.
Colorado College Southwest Scholars Program		4/1/2008	This program is designed for high school Seniors who would like to participate in a 3 week summer session in which they would take regularly scheduled undergraduate courses and actually earn a college credit. There are no costs associated with this program.
Spring Visit Day at Regis University		4/11/2008	Visit with professors, explore course offerings, and overall student life on campus.
Rotary Youth Leadership Program		4/16/2008	Open to current sophomores and juniors who have demonstrated leadership in school, church or community.
